TARGET AUDIENCE	Participation in this Equinet training is solely reserved to staff members of national equality bodies directly handling cases of alleged discrimination. The training is aimed at staff members of both 'tribunal-type' and 'non-tribunal-type' (promotional) equality bodies.
OBJECTIVES	The general objective of this training is to enhance participants' capacity in dealing with cases and to further develop their expertise in interpreting and effectively/efficiently using anti-discrimination legislation.
	The training will in particular offer opportunities to learn about and discuss with peers issues relating to:

METHODOLOGY	The training will feature presentations by eminent speakers specialised in the interpretation and application of the European equality legislation. It will also provide an opportunity for peer learning, for practical information exchange with peers from other equality bodies and for discussing, comparing and contrasting respective practices.
	The presentations will be divided into a number of sessions, thereby addressing different issues, including both procedural aspects and material aspects of equality legislation.
	The training is designed to create opportunities for participants to share their experiences and expertise. Participants will share and discuss their ideas on concrete cases and issues in three interactive workshop sessions and will be asked to contribute their experiences at the plenary sessions.
